Sixth form students who are in Year 13 doing A Level Maths or Further Maths in Year 12 can take the United Kingdom Senior Maths Challenge.

It is a 90 minute multiple choice exam taken by the best mathematicians throughout the country. The top 40% gain a certificate either Bronze, Silver or Gold in the ratio 4:2:1. The very best go onto a second round which consists of a 3 hour exam. Finally, the top mathematicians represent the United Kingdom in the International Maths Olympiad against all other countries in the world at a final. Results for the final will be in December.
