Our Year 9's faced Wilmington Grammar School in the North Kent Cricket final – a rematch of the 2017 final which we lost.


Wilmington opted to bat first and, with some excellent bowling and fielding from Beths it was difficult for them to score runs, finishing with a total of 92.




Beths Big Day Out



Students on Site

A reminder that students are still arriving particularly early in the morning and staying late into the evening.
