Coasts Project

The Holderness coastline is the fastest eroding coastline in the UK. You are going to be an investigative journalist to find out what is happening along the coast. You must return to school with a 4 page report that answers the questions set out below.

Any text copied from online sources will not be accepted as completed work. These tasks are set to improve your understanding so work must be completed by you. You can, however, copy graphs and images.

Your brief:

Introduction must include;

- A map showing the location of the Holderness coastline and a description of its location
- A summary of why the coastline is being eroded

Section 1: What is happening to the coastline?

- Investigate what has happened along the coastline. You can find images to help you describe the impacts. Look specifically for evidence of erosion.
- How has it impacted people? Include quotes from people who have been affected. This video will help https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/z8jfb9q

Section 2: What has been done to try and protect the coastline?
