Message from the Headteacher

As you know, at the beginning of this week, we had to send the whole of Year 11 and an additional small group of Year 13 students home. This was due to a couple more individuals testing positive for COVID-19.

We received a number of queries as to why the whole of Year 11 were sent to self-isolate when we had not had to do the same with the Year 13 students. All our decisions are taken following advice from the London Coronavirus Response Cell (LCRC) and they felt that, as there had been fewer students who had come into contact with the individual in Year 13, due to how their timetables are put together, we should try to keep as many of them in school because of the amount of time they had had out during the period of lockdown.

In the case of Year 11, over half the year group had come into contact with the individual and the advice was that they should all be sent to self-isolate. This also makes teaching the whole year group simpler because all their lessons are now being taken virtually.

Further, it is important that, should your son or daughter be asked to self-isolate, we would ask that all parents please ensure that they do so. This is for the health and safety of not only the school but the wider community.

You will be aware that many schools in the country and, indeed locally, have been sending students home to self-isolate due to cases within their schools and, unfortunately, we know we may have to send more students home, should further cases arise. It is therefore important that we all continue to be vigilant and continue to wear our face masks in all communal areas within the school (except classrooms), on public transport etc. However, we have had many reports of students not adhering to the facemask rules on transport and within shops so I would please ask parents to also work with your sons and daughters to empress upon them the need to abide by these rules. The students themselves who, if they do test positive to COVID-19, may not experience bad symptoms, however, it is the older generation who again seem to be hit worse. A copy of the reminder from the DfE can be found at the end of my message.

Finally, a reminder to parents and carers to please not to park in Hartford Road or the surrounding areas and, if there is a dire emergency to do so, that you avoid parking over our neighbours' drives or on the zigzag lines outside the entrance to the school.

Guidance on use of face covering when travelling to school or college

Children aged 11 and over are legally required to <u>wear a face</u> <u>covering on public transport in England</u>, unless exempt for health, age or disability reasons.

In accordance with advice from Public Health England, we recommend that local authorities advise children and young people aged 11 and over to wear a face covering when travelling on dedicated school transport, unless they are exempt. Coronavirus (COVID-19) usually spreads by droplets from coughs, sneezes and speaking. When used correctly, wearing a face covering may reduce the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19) droplets in certain circumstances, helping to protect others.

Schools should support local authorities in promoting the use of face coverings when travelling to and from school, and help them to resolve any issues of non-compliance where appropriate.

The <u>'Hands. Face. Space.' campaign</u> urges everyone to continue to wash their hands, cover their face and make space to control infection rates. The NHS has released a <u>'Hands. Face. Space.'</u> <u>video</u> that may be a useful resource when communicating the importance of wearing a face covering on transport directly to

NHS COVID-19 App 'Protect your loved Ones. Download the app.'

The NHS COVID-19 app, can be downloaded for free in England and Wales and is the fastest way to see if you are at risk from coronavirus.

The app has a number of tools to protect you, including contact tracing, local area alerts and venue check-in and uses proven technology from Apple and Google, designed to protect every user's privacy.

You will see that, around the school site, there are QR codes which you can scan into the app to log your location.

With the Great British Bake Off returning to our screens, we thought we would ask members of staff to share, each week, their favourite baking recipes. Kicking off with the Headteacher, Mr Blyghton, who today, shares his favourite Carrot Cake recipe.

Mr Blyghton's Easy Peasy Carrot Cake Recipe

Ingredients

- 150ml sunflower oil
- 180g self-raising flour
- 1tsp ground cinnamon or mixed spice
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp bicarbonate of soda
- 2 carrots grated medium/large whatever
- 110g soft brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 90g golden syrup

Icing

- 100g cream cheese or light philadelphia
- 50g butter
- 250g icing sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp cinnamon (optional)

Preparation Method

- 1. Put everything in a bowl (except sunflower oil) and mix until well combined then add oil in 2 lots and mix again that's it!
- 2. Pour into lined 8" x 8" tray tin. Or a (900g) Loaf tin (with a liner or lined)
- 3. Bake at 180°C for approximately 25 to 30 minutes or about 30-40 minutes if it's a loaf.
- 4. Leave to cool in tin for 30 minutes and tip out.

If you're trying to be good ditch the icing, the cake is so good you can do without it - but it's GOOD with the icing too! I also quite like to throw a few walnuts on top - see the picture above of the one I made last weekend.
