Message from Mr Blyghton, Headteacher

At the start of this week, we were preparing for Mass Testing of students and staff and expecting that, by Monday 18 January, all students would be back in school ... what a difference 24 hours makes! So, on Tuesday we started to re-evaluate all the plans that we had put in place to reflect the National Lockdown which had been announced at 8.00pm the previous evening.

We were convinced that our remote learning provision would be far superior to that which we had offered during the previous lockdown in 2020 as we had taken the opportunity to train staff and, although some were initially wary of this new method of teaching, all were soon learning new ways to make it fun, engaging and a really good substitute to actually being in the classroom.

As you know, we have decided to revert to our normal—out of pandemic—times of the day which, for all those students except Year 7 and 12 who were new to the school in September, will be familiar to them. Students will receive a proper registration and time with their form tutor from 8.45am before starting their first lesson at 9.10am. We have also asked students to keep their cameras on, wherever possible. There are several reasons for this. Firstly, it means the teacher can see exactly who is in the lesson and that they are ok and if they are concerned about anyone, they can then deal with this outside of the lesson. It also means that the teacher is not teaching to a blank screen—we believe that being able to see who is in your lesson makes teaching a better experience for all as you know there is someone there and also can see their reactions to what you are teaching and whether they have understood what you have taught.

I do understand that asking for cameras to be switched on can cause an unnecessary strain on some of your wifi systems where there are several of you using it all at once, but if I could ask that they turn their cameras on, even if it's just for the registration, it allows the staff member to be assured that your son or daughter is ok.

I am sure there will be some teething problems along the way but would ask that you please continue to bear with us. We will get there!

Cancellation of the Summer Examination Session

As you will know the summer exam session for both A Level and GCSE has now been cancelled.

The Secretary for Education announced that teacher assessments would replace examinations as the method for determining grades. This will be similar to the process used last year by the school. We must now await on further guidance from Ofqual and the DfE about the processes they will put in place to support schools.

We appreciate that this may cause concern and potential anxiety for some who feel they have not yet had the chance to demonstrate as much progress as they would like this year. Please be assured that students will have plenty of chances to demonstrate this over the coming months. As we did last year, teacher assessments will be holistic and will be drawn from a wide range of assessment and data sources. No single test will determine the final grade awarded to your son/daughter.

Until more information is available we ask that everyone focusses on what we can control. Students should ensure they are attending all their remote lessons, completing all work and revising their subjects thoroughly. This will allow them to be in the best possible position for any future assessments, whatever format that may take.

We ask that parents and students do not interrogate staff about any potential grades that may be awarded. They are not in a position to answer this at the moment. The guidance provided by Ofqual in 2020 was that teacher assessments were confidential right up to the point of Results Day in August and could only be challenged afterwards on the grounds of a genuine inputting mistake or proving serious malpractice in the calculation of the said grades. Whilst this position hasn't been announced, it should give you an idea of what you should possibly expect.

In the interim period, both Year 11 and 13 parents will have received reports at the end of the Autumn term and this should help to flag up to students where they need to make improvements to ensure their final grades are the best they can possibly achieve.

As we receive more information we will ,of course, share this with you.

Beths 100km Run to Brighton!

The PE Department are challenging you to run to Brighton (99.8km) over the next 5 weeks, and here's how it works…

- 1. You need to download the Nike Run Club app on your phone.
- 2. You need to register (it's free) and create a username. Please make your username your full name, with your form after your surname e.g Jake Smith 7B
- 3. You then need to click the add friend logo top right of the homepage. Search 'Mr C Webb Beths'. You should see my username. Add me as a friend.
- 4. I will then invite you to the challenge, of which you will need to accept.



5. Remember to take your phone when you run, and the distance you run will automatically be added to the overall Challenge Leaderboard!

And that's it, you're in! 100km is an average of 20km a week for the next 5 weeks. A 5km run will take you around half an hour or so, so 4 runs a week should do the trick. Try to get as many of your friends involved as possible, as it will be good have a fun day out in Brighton! Also every week the top 3 from each year group will be mentioned on the School PE and Sport Twitter, and be rewarded. Good luck!

When tested for Covid...

If your son or daughter is tested for Covid-19, please alert the school and do not allow them to return until they have received a negative test result. Again, should they be unfortunate enough to test positive, please inform the school immediately so that we can alert the LCRC for guidance.

Similarly, should anyone within your household take a test for Covid-19, we ask that your child remain at home until the test results are known. If the result is positive, they will need to continue

to remain at home isolating for 14 days from the start of the symptoms or, if there were none, for 14 days from the date the test was taken.

If you have any queries regarding isolation and what you should do, please contact the school and we will try to help you out.

We would also like to reassure you that we will also endeavour to include your son or daughter in lessons as they are taught. We have had some excellent lessons taking place within the classroom with absent students taking part at the same time via Zoom or Microsoft Teams.
