MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER



I think this is the first week that we have been able to run as we would expect. It is always exciting to see how students and staff begin a new school year with fresh impetus. Their interactions in starting upon and setting new goals to move learning and understanding forward is a special moment that escapulates why many of us are teachers. The light bulb moments where students suddenly understand is pure magic and I know that this year will continue this as we reconnect our thinking.

We are approaching the end of September with the sun moving into the southern hemisphere so our evenings will continue to noticeably be drawn in with darkness. The 11 plus results for Year 6 children will be published in about two weeks time and in the continuing presence of the pandemic, the School has reluctantly changed its plans for hosting year 6 events in school this Autumn. It has been agreed with Bexley Grammar and Chis & Sid that we will each hold open mornings involving no more than 30 families at a time instead of hosting much larger events.

Therefore the calendared date of Saturday 16th October where we intended to hold a large year 6 event that showed the school in its best light has unfortunately had to be cancelled and replaced by a series of smaller ones that will take place during the normal school hours. The knock-on effect is that Monday 18th October will be a normal school day.

A reminder to all families who use public transport. TfL require all students to wear a face mask on their buses and trains. Please ensure that you do wear one and have consideration for your fellow travellers.


