## Messages from Mr Blyghton, Headteacher

As we hurtle towards the end of term, events within the school calendar mean that there are some changes to the school day. On Wednesday 7 July, there will be some disruption to lessons due to the individual Celebration of Achievement events for Years 7-10; likewise, on the Thursday, there will be no normal lessons due to Sports Day – more details of which will follow. On Tuesday 13 July, our Year 10 students will be in their enterprise day doing their 'Stock Market Challenge' with Year 9 students in their 'Soap Challenge' on the Wednesday. Years 7 and 8 will have 'Suits You' and 'Rollercoaster' on Thursday 15 July. On Friday 16, we will have year group final assemblies, and students will be dismissed between midday and 1.00pm – again, full details to follow next week.

Don't forget that our Art Exhibition takes place this Saturday at Gallery No32 in Bexley from 10.00-17.00 so do pop along and support the department. Bexley Cricket Ground, who are next door to the Gallery, will also be open and will happily be serving refreshments.

Next week I will be updating you all on changes that we will be making to the school day from September – these are just very small updates to the timings for the school day and the length of lessons and lunchtimes. It is also hoped that students will not have to remain quite so rigorously within their bubbles but I am waiting on Government advice prior to confirming this to you.

I was also disappointed that, after many weeks of having no positive cases of Covid-19 in the school, this week we were forced to send students from two year groups home to self-isolate. Finally, the latest announcements seem to suggest that we may be able to get away during the summer break so I'm contemplating whether to book a tour to the vineyards in Portugal or the volcanos in Palma or whether to avoid any chance of having to isolate upon my return, and consider vacating in Poole!

### Jackson Civils Work Experience by Oluwaseye O, 11H

On Monday 21 June I completed my work experience at Jackson Civils, an engineering firm with several offices located nationwide. During the 2-hour session they talked about the various techniques they use in their water defense projects such as gabions, rock armor and diversion canals, as well as this we did several activities including Q&As and quizzes.

During the Q&A, Jackson Civils shared with us the importance of community in all the work that they do. They complete school liaisons (where they offer engineering career workshops) every year and recently launched a charity called the 'One Group Foundation' which aims to provide for all the communities that they work in.

Furthermore, they further elaborated on how their operations are set up to keep the environment in mind as they constantly review all the possible environmental effects of their work. This is because they operate within specific BSI standards – this ensures that companies like Jackson Civils uphold environmental sustainability.

Overall, this work experience placement was very informative and helpful in helping me to decide on my future career path, not only now have I learnt about how a company such as Jackson Civils operates but also how vital it is for companies and their staff to support the communities which they work in as the forefront of all their projects.

### The Boy Who Steals Houses

This book, follows a boy Sam, who survives by breaking into vacant houses and sleeping there, eating their food, and wearing their clothes. However, one day he is caught, like a deer in headlights, and manages to play it off as though he is a family friend. However, while caught up in the façade, Sam falls in love with Moxie, the daughter of the man whose house he "stole". The book uses analepsis frequently to explain Sam's tragic backstory of abandonment and abuse. Inevitably, Sam is found out to be a thief and his cover is blown, but we, as readers, learn that reform and remorse can be achieved by being in a loving environment.

It must be said, this book was the best book I read in 2020; it wasn't even close. While the story takes longer than expected to pick up, once it did the plot felt coherent, and the characters had enough depth to leave the reader satisfied. My favourite thing about this book is the message it gives to the audience, which is that one's background is not what defines them, but their choices. It inspires those from not so privileged upbringings to actively change and improve themselves, like Sam did in the story. The other core message is the importance of forgiveness, as the book, especially towards the end, shows kindness and mercy prevailing over bitterness and ruthlessness, which is something that should happen in the real world too, but is a rare occurrence. Overall, I definitely recommend the book as it is well worth its price.
