Messages from Mr Blyghton, Headteacher

We were all disappointed to hear Boris Johnson's announcement on Monday regarding the extension to restrictions until Monday 19 July. We had planned to finally be able to invite our new Year 7 students into school on 6 July so that they could at last set foot inside the place where they will spend the next seven years of their life. However, we are now planning to offer them a virtual experience — as we did last year — with an Induction Day, over MS Teams on 6 July which will involve meeting the Head of Year and then splitting off into their form groups to spend time with their tutors.

It would appear that our plans for Sports Day can continue – so long as we have risk assessments in place. This will take place on Thursday 8 July at Erith Athletics Stadium and we will forward more details regarding this to parents shortly.

You may also like to make a note in your diaries that our Art Exhibition will be taking place on Saturday 10 July and, in a first for the school, will be taking place outside at Galley 32 in Manor Road, Bexley. The exhibition takes place from 10.00am until 5.00pm and we do hope that you will be able to pop along.

SLT have spent the last couple of weeks working with our Heads of Departments finalising the grades that we believe our Year 11 and 13 students should be awarded in August. This has been an intense period but we are now content that the data used was robust and fair and can only hope that the exam boards are in agreement.

I am delighted that we will also be offering Year 7 and 8 parents a 'Parents Evening' which will take place virtually over 'Schoolcloud' on Tuesday 13 July (Year 8) and Thursday 15 July (Year 7) between 12.45pm and 4.00pm. Discussion is still ongoing as to what we will do with students on these afternoons but I hope to confirm this detail to you very soon.

With the weather being so hot at the moment, until the UK reverts to temperatures fit for a Viking's ice palace, please can I remind you to ensure your child is wearing plenty of sunscreen and has access to enough water to ensure they remain safe.

And finally can I remind all students that wearing a face covering on public transport is mandatory and those not wearing one will be refused entry onto the vehicle.

Spotlight on Beths Grammar School Alumni



I started at Beths in 2003, and studied here for seven years, completing my A levels in PE, Biology and French. I was lucky enough to be involved in both the football teams and rugby teams while at the school. I enjoyed the diversity of subjects and teaching styles and these were some of the reasons why I initially decided to go to Beths, and also formed part of my decision to stay at the school in the sixth form. The university application process is a stressful time, but the staff were always on hand and I've never seen anyone work harder than Mrs Hubert, who did a fabulous job at helping with our UCAS applications, but sadly has recently retired.

I then went on to study Sport and Exercise Science at the University of Essex, one of the top universities for this course at the time. I loved the course and developed so many different skills. I was always very interested in science and learning how to apply this knowledge to sport was brilliant. Understanding training methods, the science behind different exercise forms and the biomechanics of movement was what really interested me.

After completing university, I started a personal training business and worked with clients all over London, in parks, their homes and gyms. It was a fantastic experience, not just because I was helping people reach their goals but also because I was learning all sorts of different skills involved with running a business. Marketing, sales, design, writing articles, dealing with finances etc.

After 3 years of running the business, things just fell into place and there came a perfect opportunity for me to go travelling.

Travelling was something I had always wanted to do, but never really thought I could. Maybe because I didn't have the money, or I wasn't the type of person who would go travelling. It was the best six months of my life. I started with 6 weeks in India — nothing like jumping in at the deep end. It was, and still is, my favourite country in the world. From there I moved on to Southeast Asia. Although it sounds very cliché, I really learnt a lot about myself when I was travelling. I would encourage anyone to do it. Preferably on your own.









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I enjoyed it so much that I wanted to extend my trip. I had heard about people teaching English abroad to save up some money and then head off travelling some more. So, I investigated it and China seemed like a good place. I could easily find a good job and start saving money.

That's when things took a different turn.

I realised that I actually quite liked this teaching lark. I also really loved where I was living. I didn't want to leave.

I have now been here for four years, living in Ningbo, China, with my

wife. Next semester I will move to a school that teaches the British curriculum and teach PE. I am hoping to also complete my PGCE and get Qualified Teacher Status, which would mean I could teach back home in the UK if I ever wanted to return.

I have started playing for the city rugby club, and recently completed my first ever Spartan race here. Life is good.

The COVID situation has been frustrating, not because life here is very different, but more because it has meant that I haven't seen my family for nearly two years. I have my parents, sister, nephew, and niece that I miss very much, but I have no doubt that I will be back home soon to see them.





Moving to China was a random idea and I was planning on staying for a year at the most. It turned out to be the best decision I made. I have a wife, a new career and am living in a wonderful city exploring the amazing culture.

Gold medal winner at Kent School Championships

Congratulations to Dante in Year 10 who last Saturday ran at Kent School Championships (100 meters) winning first place with a time of 10.88 seconds! This places him second in the UK in the under 17's (Year 10/Year 11) age group.

Dante said that this was an emotional occasion as he managed to meet his personal goal of breaking the 11 second barrier. This time now allows him to qualify for running in the Junior European Athletics Championships. This is likely to be held this time next year in Jerusalem and he is very much looking forward to this!

Dante trains three times a week and has been running for almost two and half years. He is working hard to keep training but also finding time for revision and study for his upcoming trial exams next week – we wish him well with his future athletics championships (and his trial exams!)

Radio Beths: We aim to raise £5,000!




We are looking to launch another ambitious project: running a school radio at Beths and encourage students to use this media channel to broaden horizons and improve cultural awareness in an inclusive environment.
