## Bexley Foodbank Collection



On Wednesday the 11<sup>th</sup> of December, Bexley Foodbank came into our school to collect all of the food that we had been collecting for them – and there was plenty of it! Each form group designed a hamper that had a Christmassy theme and then they put all of their donations inside the hamper. There were some amazing hampers, and Gill Bates, from Bexley Foodbank, thought so too.

Bexley Food Bank most commonly has volunteers such as DofE students and people over the age of 18, which are DBS checked. However, anyone who wants to get involved outside of school need just visit the Bexley Food Bank website; it has tons of information on what is going on and periodically, there are opportunities at offer for anyone wishing to help this association.

We asked her a few questions about Bexley Foodbank and why she enjoyed being involved in it:

### 1. Why did you first get involved in food banks?

I'd been working for the police for twenty -two years and I wanted to do something else within the community.

### 2. How long have you been working at the food bank for?

I've been working at the food bank since July 2013.

3. How do you know that people are genuine and aren't just there for free food – do you need verification that they are struggling?

Luckily each person has a voucher and social services assess them and then decide whether or not they require the help of the food bank.

### 4. Does each person have a limit of how much food they can take?

Well it depends on the size of the family really, but you're only allowed to take 3-5 helpings of food every six months.

# 5. Do you run the food bank alone or you do you have help from other people?

I have over one hundred and thirty volunteers that help me run the food bank and this has allowed us to help loads of people over the past years. In my first year of working at the food bank, we fed 1049 people – in 2018 we fed 7833.

Our school showed a great example in helping our community. We held a Christmas hamper competition, where each form in Years 7 and 8 created a Christmas hamper containing donations

such as food essentials, toiletries etc.
Great hampers were produced by all forms and the winners for both years were Cray!





## Happy Chinese New Year!



#### What is Chinese New Year?

Chinese New Year is the most important holiday in China. In 2020, Chinese New Year begins on January 25<sup>th</sup> and marks the beginning of the year of the rat. It is also known as the 'Spring Festival' or the 'Lunar New Year'. Each new year represents the characteristics of one of the 12 zodiac animals: the rat, ox, tiger, rabbit, dragon, snake, horse, sheep, monkey, rooster, dog and pig.

### America faces Iran

President Donald Trump made the killing of Iranian general Qassem Suleimani a theme of his re-election campaign on Thursday, drawing cheers from thousands at a rally when he said the death saved lives and delivered "American justice".

At the campaign rally in Toledo, Ohio, Trump spent a lengthy part of his stump speech defending his order to kill Suleimani and rejecting criticism from Democrats who say he overstepped his authority with the US military's drone strike against the commander of Iran's military al-Quds force at Baghdad airport a week ago.

He accused Suleimani of organising violent protests by Iran-backed groups at the US embassy in Baghdad earlier this month. Trump, who frequently discusses his support of the US military, said that if he had not sent US troops to protect the embassy, the demonstrators might have broken in and killed Americans or taken them hostage, a repeat of the 2011 storming of a US diplomatic facility in Benghazi, Libya, in which the US ambassador was killed.

"Last week the United States once again took the bold and decisive action to save American lives and deliver American justice," he said.

Trump and his top advisers have said Suleimani was masterminding "imminent" attacks against American targets in the Middle East, but have drawn criticism for not providing more detail to back up the claim. "Suleimani was actively planning new attacks and he was looking very

very seriously at our embassies, and not just the embassy in Baghdad, but we stopped him and we stopped him quickly and we stopped him cold," Trump said.

Suleimani's death prompted an Iranian retaliatory missile strike on Tuesday night against two bases hosting US and coalition troops in Iraq. Trump said he had been ready to launch retaliatory strikes until he was told that no American casualties had resulted.

While tensions remain, a broad war between the US and Iran has not erupted and Democrats are battling to rein-in Trump's ability to launch a new conflict in the Middle East.

### **FIFA World Cup**


The FIFA world cups were very exciting this year with England performing very well and nearly winning and a lot of underdogs proving themselves. Most people got involved and countries were cheering each other on.


