






SUMMER ART EXHIBITION




STEM CLUB

METACOGNITION AND SELF REGULATION

In school, we are trying to promote metacognition as part of our everyday pedagogy. We have included here some information for parents and carers about metacognition, how it can help students to be more critical thinkers and how it can support young people in their learning.

What is metacognition?

Metacognition can be defined as 'thinking about thinking,' but more specifically refers to the knowledge and understanding of what we know and how we think. This includes an awareness of how we regulate our thinking when we work on a task.

What is self-regulation?

Self-regulation broadly refers to an awareness of our behaviour and how we need to behave to achieve our goals. There are three useful questions that parents/carers can ask in relation to support metacognitive regulation:

- 1. Planning (start of the task): How will you approach this learning task and why?
- 2. Monitoring (during the task): Is your plan working or do you need to try something else?
- 3. Evaluating (after the task): What have you learnt about yourself and your learning?

METACOGNITION AND SELF REGULATION

Why is it important?

Research suggests that metacognition shapes learners to become more active (and less passive) in their learning. This increased awareness of how we learn, in turn, helps promote deeper learning and motivation. Further, research-based recommendations and supporting documentation can be found here.

How to encourage metacognition

When supporting scholars with work or homework, if asking questions then please allow for increased wait time, this can promote independence and support greater metacognition as outlined. Parents and carers can support scholars in encouraging them to use models. Teachers provide models with appropriate levels of support (scaffolding) when new knowledge or concepts are taught in school. For more information follow this link.

Specific and targeted questioning is another way that scholars can be maximise their learning. This excellent blog in the Times Educational Supplement (TES) offers some tips in relation to how teachers question in the classroom. These tips could be useful for parents and carers to replicate when scholars are overlearning or relearning knowledge for homework.
