Structured Writing:

There are three essay questions in this section, each comprising 4 bullet points. You must choose <u>one</u> to answer.

In total, you should write 120 words, so that's about 40 words for each bullet point. You must give and justify an opinion!

## **Unstructured Writing:**

There are three essay questions in this section, each comprising 2 bullet points. You must choose one to answer.

In total, you should write 150 words, so that's about 75 words for each bullet point. You must use a range of tenses!

#### Translation:

You must write a translation from English into the Target language (around 50 words).

As you write this translation, you should cross off the words on the

		question paper as you translate them, so that you are sure you don't miss anything. Underline and annotate the tense for each verb before you start.  To revise:  Same advice as for the speaking exam (see above).
Music	1 Paper (1hr 30) We will be completing a full paper including all set works covered to date. This will include both an unknown listening as well as a dictation question.	Review the key elements of music and the terminology that are associated with that element of music. In the dictation, remember to work out the space that is left before the first playing of the extract. Section A will focus on the four Areas of Study, Section B will include the longer response question. In the longer response section, make sure that you are focusing on the elements of music that you have been asked to discuss. You have to refer to the unknown listening work as well as the known piece in order to be able to access higher marks. Overall, don't over think it.
Physical Education	1 paper (1 hr 15) Anatomy and Physiology, Movement Analysis and Sports Psychology	Read through the 9m marker before answering the shorter questions to determine how much time you are going to need to write it.  Remember to use the BUC technique for all questions so that you are clear on what exactly the question is asking.  If a scenario or example is provided, you must always link your answer to this.  Be really clear on your examples, providing lots of specific information on it (assume that the examiner knows nothing about your example)  Read through the mock papers and all of the resources that I have shared with you (exam booklets and questions on the interactive PowerPoint to revise for this)
Physics	1 paper (1hr 30) P1 to P5 and P6.1	Section A contains 15 multiple choice questions.(calculations included) Section B contains Graphs, calculations, Extended writing (6 marker), short answer questions, practical skills. Sample Paper will be posted on teams.
Religious Studies	1 paper (2hrs) Students need to revise the following four themes: Relationships, Life and Death, Good and Evil and Human Rights.
