Senior School Boys receive Honours Ties

On the first Key Stage 4 Senior School assembly of this term we were delighted to award the first ever batch of "Honours Ties" to 31 boys in both Year 10 and Year 11. Honours Ties have been introduced as a new addition to our rewards policy. The Ties are awarded to boys who have demonstrated a sustained and significant commitment to serving the school and/or wider community. It is recognition of exceptional academic scholarship, outstanding contribution to the



life of the school and clear endorsement of the school values.

At Beths Grammar School academic expectations are central to our purpose. We strive to ensure that talent is nurtured and learning is valued. At Beths, challenge is welcomed, participation is expected and achievement is prized and celebrated. We are committed to educating well-rounded individuals who embody our core values of Excellence, Community, Respect and Nurture. We are aware that a large number of our boys demonstrate not only exceptional behaviour in and outside of school but also exceptional attitude to their studies and the wider life of the school. We are also extremely proud of the natural leadership skills our boys develop as they move up through the school and subsequently become excellent role models and mentors for our younger students.

An Honours Tie is reserved for Senior School boys and it will replace the boy's current house tie. The tie is navy and gold and is gifted to the student along with a certificate. Boys who are eligible for an Honours Tie will be determined by the awards panel which will be made up of Deputy Headteacher and the Head of Year. They will consider carefully that;

• The achievement reflects the long term commitment to and success of the students' academic studies and wider school activities.

- The achievement brings honour to the school
- The student is abiding by the school rules and behaving in line with expectations.

The boys who received these ties were delighted with their achievement and it is safe to say that the new honours tie is the latest fashion statement every Beths boy wants to be seen wearing! We look forward to awarding more Honours Ties as the year progresses.

Students on Site

A reminder that there are still an increasing number of students arriving particularly early in the morning and staying late into the evening. Safety and Courtesy
